PE—Wednesday mornings

Please make sure your child has a complete PE kit in school at all times. All items should be named. Long hair must be tied up and earrings must be removed.

Homework

Ideally children should read daily but the minimum expectation is 10 minutes 3 times a week. Books can usually be changed every day that the children return them. Any paper homework will go out on a Thursday and is to be returned by the following Tuesday.

English

The first English text for this term is a fiction text called Journey to the Lonely Mountain, and we will be focussing on character description. This will be about the character's appearance, personality, details of how the character is feeling, using the physical signs, such as 'the hair on his neck stood on end', etc.

The second text for this term is a non-fiction explanation text, which relates to our topic week, which is European study. This includes features such as an introduction, conclusion and using non-chronological order.

Science

We will be completing our unit on Electricity, and starting the new topic of changing states

Spanish will continue by reinforcing the basics and moving through the various subjects of the topic

Children will develop their speaking and listening skills whilst building confidence.


Geography Week

During this term we will be having a Geography week. We will be looking at map reading and a European Study. At home, children can do some research about Europe.

They could:

- Create fact files
- Research different countries, their traditions, culture, climate, etc.
- Look at maps of Europe and learn the names of the capital cities,
- Learn about the climate and animal and plant life of different European countries.
- Artwork in the style of a particular European country.

Any learning at home will help to provide prior knowledge and understanding of the subject we will be teaching in our lessons in school, and can be displayed on our working walls.
